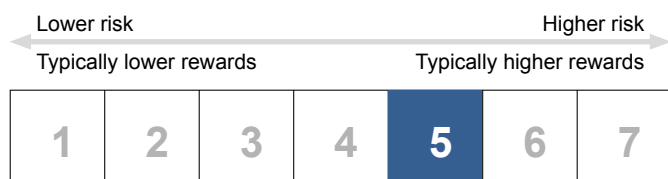
IPM Systematic Macro UCITS Fund Share Class I EUR (ISIN: IE00BX906V41)

The IPM Systematic Macro UCITS Fund (the "Fund") is a sub-fund of FundLogic Alternatives Plc (the "Company").

OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

- The Fund's investment objective is to provide Shareholders with returns (i) based on IPM's systematic programme which aims to generate consistent positive returns that are largely independent of returns from traditional asset classes (ii) investments in transferable securities and money market instruments issued by government issuers; and (iii) investments in cash deposits and cash equivalent securities, in order to gain exposure to the IPM Systematic Macro Programme (the "IPM Programme")
- The IPM Programme, which is owned and operated by the investment manager, aims to take long positions in equity, bond and currency markets that are expected to deliver positive returns in the view of the investment manager and short positions in equity, bond and currency markets that are expected to deliver negative returns in the view of the investment manager
- The Fund may invest in a wide range of instruments including shares and share-like instruments, investment-grade fixed income instruments, cash and cash equivalents, collective investment schemes and foreign exchange contracts either directly or through financial contracts known as derivatives. It may also invest into transferable securities, which may be in the form of structured financial instruments and closed ended collective investment schemes that are deemed to be transferable securities, in order to gain exposure to the IPM Programme (the "Fund Assets")
- The Fund may be leveraged up to 1500% of its net asset value. Leverage is calculated using the full notional amount of each financial derivative instrument
- Costs incurred in the use of derivatives may have a negative effect on the Fund's performance
- Additionally, the costs of buying and selling investments are paid out of the Fund's assets and may have a negative impact on the Fund's performance. These costs are in addition to those listed in the section headed 'Charges' below
- The investment manager monitors the Fund daily and has discretion to change the asset allocation
- Any income from the Fund will be re-invested and the Fund will not pay out any dividends
- The value of the Fund is calculated and published daily except in certain circumstances as set out in the Company's prospectus and the Fund's supplement (collectively "Prospectus"). Investors can buy and/or sell back their shares daily
- The Fund is most suitable for investors with at least a three to five year investment horizon

Other risks that you should be aware of, which may not be captured by the Risk and Reward Indicator, include:

- The Fund's success is dependent on the performance of the IPM Programme. The IPM Programme is expected to have medium-to-high volatility. The IPM Programme has exposure to derivatives, which may increase its volatility. The different markets traded or individual positions held by the IPM Programme may be highly correlated to one another at times and may expose the Fund to significant losses
- The Fund may use certain investment strategies that could result in the Fund losing money in a rising market
- The use of derivatives involves a higher level of complexity than a direct investment and may multiply the gains or losses of the Fund on a given investment or its investments generally
- Investment in the Fund may be affected by operational risks at the investment manager, the administrator and other service providers to the Fund. The investment manager manages the Fund and so the success of the Fund depends, among other things, upon the ability of the investment manager to manage the asset allocation of the Fund
- As the Fund Assets may be valued in currencies other than the Fund's base currency, its performance may be down or up due to changes in foreign exchange rates
- In certain instances, the directors of the Fund may temporarily suspend trading in Fund shares and this may affect your ability to buy or sell shares
- The Fund will purchase or enter into Fund Assets from several counterparties, exposing the Fund to the issuer or credit risk of these

counterparties

- The assets of the Fund may be exposed to entities which employ leverage to achieve optimal returns. Such use of leverage may increase the volatility of these assets and impact the performance of the Fund
- The volatility and illiquidity of futures prices may lead to losses. The Fund may trade futures on a leveraged basis, which may result in immediate and substantial losses for the Fund
- Trading decisions are based on mathematical analysis of technical factors related to past performance and market activity such as price fluctuations or trading volume variations. The profitability of such a strategy depends on the occurrence in the future of significant, sustained price moves

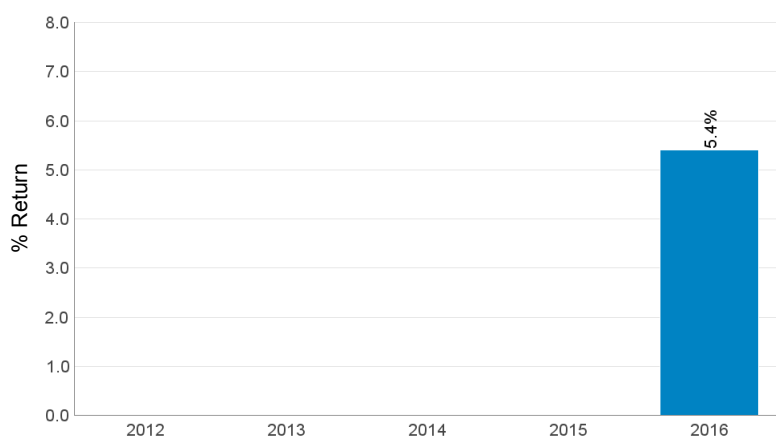
